

Lick Skillet Quilt Guild Member's Challenge "Everybody Knows an Idiom" For the 2016 Quilt Show

Do you know an idiom?

All LSQG members are invited to participate in the "Everybody Knows an Idiom" Member Challenge for the 2016 Quilt Show. If you aren't quite sure what an idiom is, it is an expression with a meaning that is not predictable from the usual meaning, such as, "kick the bucket" or "hang one's head".

So, put on your thinking caps and join us in this challenge by requesting randomly chosen idioms, which were selected by the LSQG President.

You will be provided two (2) idioms and must choose one of them for your quilt theme. The idioms will remain confidential and will not be shared with any other guild member unless you choose to share it yourself!

At the show, this quilt will be judged primarily on your interpretation of the idiom and your creativity.

The challenge rules are:

- 1. The size of the quilt can be no smaller than 24" on its smallest side and no larger than 36" on its largest side.**
- 2. Your quilt must be "your" interpretation of what your idiom means to you or what you think best represents the saying.**
- 3. Each quilt must have a minimum of three (3) types of embellishments. This can be beading, buttons, crystal, trim, applique, etc. but can have no lace.**
- 4. Your quilt must be three (3) layers consisting of a quilt top, batting and backing and can only be quilted by YOU. Your quilting can be done by hand, by machine or both. Tied quilts are not eligible.**
- 5. The quilt challenge entry form for this challenge must be submitted by the August 1, 2016 deadline and must be accompanied with a photo.**
- 6. The quilt must be turned in to Quilt Show Receiving on September 17, 2016.**

Be sure you read the rules carefully so that you will meet all of the guidelines to prevent your quilt from any chance of getting disqualified during the judging!

This challenge is a chance to have fun and let your creativity be your guide!
